#### Friday 17 August 2.30 – 3.30: UNKNOWN FRANK HURLEY

Adventurous cinematographer Frank Hurley is best remembered for his extraordinary work in Antarctica and Papua New Guinea, but his career was diverse. He was an official cameraman during World War I and did other freelance work. At Sydney's Cinesound Studio in the 1930s he turned his talents to feature films and travelogues. This will be a presentation of three of his quirky short documentaries *Jewel of the Pacific (Lord Howe Island), The Australian Flight 1919* and *Treasures of Katoomba: a ramble midst crags and dales.* Hurley had an inimitable style, especially when he insisted on doing his own narrations.

**'Do it big, do it right, give it class'** was the credo of MGM boss, Louis B Mayer, who ran Hollywood's most prestigious studio of the 1930s and 1940s. This standard distinguished its short subjects as well as its feature films, as this selection from the golden age proves: a Pete Smith speciality on "Movie Pests", a John Nesbitt Passing Parade "Of Pups and Puzzles", an Our Gang (aka Little Rascals) comedy and Robert Benchley's classic "A Night at the Movies".


#### Friday 23 November 5.30 - 7.00 BARRY YORK: REACHING FOR THE STARS


