The NFSA is a National Treasure – the aim of the Friends of the NFSA is to support its operation and allow access to the marvellous collection through regular companionable activities.



#### Around the traps; The Lithgow Film Society - Ross Adams.

The Lithgow Valley Film Society was formed in 2002 when the Coordinator moved from Cumnock in Western NSW to Lithgow. The city had not had an operating commercial cinema for over 30 years, even though the three original buildings still existed. One had been converted to a fitness gym, another to a concert hall and used for stage shows. The third, the Theatre Royal still has the 70mm projectors, the Dress Circle, stage and screen. The downstairs area was converted for use as a disco and restaurant but has not been is use for some eight years. The nearest commercial cinemas are at Mount Victoria, Katoomba and Bathurst.

The Lithgow Valley Film Society has around 250 members and screens in a converted double shop area owned by Lithgow City Council. A peppercorn rent allows the Society to function economically with screenings every fortnight and often weekly catering for the older members of the community. Andrew Pike. OAM, and the former Mayor of Lithgow, Cr. Maree Statham are Patrons.

The screening policy is a mix of new releases, usually on the first weekend of the month and classic movies on the third weekend. Additional screenings are programmed for special events such as Anzac Day, Australia Day, Queen's Birthday Weekend, Remembrance Day and often mini festivals to celebrate the lives of famous actors.

Guest presenters are also a feature of the society's program and have included Andrew Pike, Richard Keys and Anthony Buckley. Generally on the last Sunday of each month a special documentary program – "artSUNDAY" is run featuring movies that do not appear in mainstream cinemas and in many cases even in film societies. This year quite a few from the Ronin Films catalogue have been screened to record attendances. The "artSUNDAY" sessions are preceded with drinks and savouries as well as an interval where coffee and cakes are served.

The society uses 16mm, 35mm and DVD projection, the latter mainly for new releases. Movie rights are accessed from the major distributors. The Lithgow group is one of only a few in Australia to screen more than once a month and without a break throughout the year. The group has sole use of the shop area which has been converted as a 63 seat cinema with comfortable cinema seats, curtained screen and dimming lights. There is even a chandelier in the auditorium. All ratios can be projected on the 18foot screen which is fabricated from a special reflective material giving a brilliant image. The average attendance is around 30 members with some sessions attracting 50 or more.

Special sessions are run for community groups as fund-raisers and a Pre-Movie Dinner followed by a movie is held quarterly on a Friday evening, using a nearby Motel Restaurant for the meal. The Lithgow group is a registered member of the Australian Film Societies Federation and members of other registered film societies and cinema-related groups such as "The Friends" are always welcome to attend sessions as visitors.
